They were nominated on the basis of a 10 year effort to restore the health of the Dee River by researching the downstream affects of the historic Mt Morgan Gold Mine and lobbying State and Federal Governments to take action to rehabilitate the mine site and the Dee River. After 10 years significant progress has been achieved, but there is a long way to go.</i>
